4. What is the name of the ranking – or "kalender" – in speed skating, based on the skaters' all-time personal records at four distances?	
5. In ballet, what term names a controlled full spin on one leg? The non-working leg is held in a specific position while the head turns rapidly to fix the gaze on one spot.	
6. The government of India launched which public service television channel in 1959? It spread nationwide through the 1970s and 80s, runs many spinoff channels, and is now operated by Prasar Bharati, which also broadcasts All India Radio.
